STAKEHOLDER MEETING

1. Call to Order

Nathan Ausley called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

2. Public Comment

No public Comment was heard

3. Explanation of Groundwater Management Area and Desired Future Conditions Process

Steve Young gave a presentation on Desired Future Conditions. Public comment was heard from Bob Prussner asking if we consider water movement between aquifers and how does the GAM account for interaction between the aquifers. Public Comment was heard from Curtis Chubb asking which criteria GMA 12 was using. Bill Graham stated that there are many differences in ways the GAM can be run. Steve Young agreed and stated that there is room for interpretation. Trevor with U.R.S. gave a presentation on Groundwater Modeling. Public comment was heard from Curtis Chubb concerning flows in the water budget. Nathan Ausley addressed differences in how water wells impact each other. Curtis Chubb stated that the shallow portions of the aquifer will go dry before the deeper part. Dwayne Jekel stated that in Marlow when the Simsboro well was drilled the Simsboro formation had no water and the well was finished in the Hooper formation. Bill Graham asked if there is any recharge data in the model. Robert Ware stated that no water is moving yet and that the GAM is the best estimate of the impact and that this board is responsible for the aquifers in the District and we can pull permits back if needed. Trevor with U.R.S. explained the distribution of pumping for model runs. Nathan Ausley stated that the District can reduce permits and that the Historic use permits will be reduced last. Bill Graham asked what are the chances of our District having to compromise in the GMA 12 process. Nathan Ausley stated that we will have to change. Bill Graham asked what population change is included in the GAM runs. Bill Graham asked if Chapter 36 allows for reduction of permits. Ridge Kaiser commented that the outcrop drawdown is limited to most North and West areas and stated that 80% of the area is artesian pressure decline. Curtis Chubb stated that this does include artesian pressure decline. Ridge Kaiser stated that there has been 150 ft drawdown in the Simsboro in the District from the Bryan/College Station well field over the last 50 years and 200 ft at their own well field and that these impacts we are considering today are from 2010 forward. Todd Hughes asked with historic use and projections is there any way to know what will happen sooner. Gary Westbrook responded that past monitoring and production from Alcoa and Bryan/ College Station has given some accuracy of projected impacts. Joe Cooper asked if the unconfined area expands as time goes on, Steve Young replied yes. Steve Young replied that no templates are absolute and that you (stakeholders) are part of this process and can help guide this. No DFC's have been adopted or decided on. One member of the public asked if getting .15 feet of water for every foot of drawdown wasn't a bad thing?

4. Request for Stakeholder input to the District

Public comment was heard from Bill Graham with concern about being impacted as a producer and landowner in the outcrop. Public comment was heard from Curtis Chubb concerning the DFC process.
